The TDR Game is a unique do-it-yourself program which helps players understand the concept of transferable development rights.

How Does the TDR Game Work?

Players are divided into small teams that work together solving simulated development problems. The Game has been developed and refined through four years of research and actual use. Players are confronted with—and learn to solve—problems that are likely to arise in the real world.
